PMAST CELEBRATES 25 YEARS OF SERVICE

In 1998, I attended U of C Mediation and Negotiation Program, following which I returned to coach in additional classes. One of the students I met was a Youth Probation Officer who remarked that what a difference it could make to the youth he worked with. The concept of Peer Mediation was just a gleam in Winston Blake's eye. After much discussion and a proposal, his supervisor approved a pilot at Lord Shaughnessy High School in 1999 and so it began.

This school functioned as an Integrated Occupational Program school under Principal Brad Adams. The students were a mixture of diverse ethnicities, youth struggling with developmental and educational challenges, those coming out of lock-up, and those expelled from other schools. This school had it's own probation officer!

Students were hand-picked for the program, as the "most in need" and were basically given the option to either attend this program or be suspended/expelled. Not too happy to be in this class. But they got it! The programs continued and we trained more students and developed Peer Mediation Teams. The change in these students was remarkable and incredibly the worst bullies, ring leaders, etc. became the best peer mediators.

The success rate for mediations by the student mediators, including student/teacher issues, was over 80%.

This was just the beginning – since then PMAST has worked with well over 2000 youth in Calgary and Area and it is always gratifying to hear someone you meet say "Oh I was in that program back in the day and here's what it did for me".

Our programs developed to meet the needs of our clientele, to work with families - a program for parents and teens to improve their family communication and dynamics, young offenders and the newest refugee and immigrant students.



In 3 years, the graduation rate increased from about 25% to over 60%.

CONFLICT IS A FACT OF LIFE...

We recognize that conflict is a fact of life for everyone, not just children and youth. We all have to deal with conflict at some point, whether with family, friends, at work, or at play. It is how we deal with it that determines our success and the impact on our well being. Conflict is an **opportunity** to learn more about a topic, to learn to appreciate other points of view, to building better relationships and stronger teams. By trying to understand what the other person is actually meaning, and encouraging their ideas and input, makes for better solutions and stronger teams for all of us.

That's what PMAST is all about!

YOUTH
LEGACY
PROJECT

STATSCAN claims we spend over \$14 MILLION EVERY DAY on adult incarceration alone: so how do we change this? How many adult offenders were juvenile offenders? PMAST researched how we currently deal with young offenders and how that does not seem to be working. We looked at how we can reduce youth criminal activity and lower the recidivism rate. That is the goal of this project.

Research and the experience and expertise of our core advisors indicates the one common denominator with youth falling within the judicial system, is their inability to deal with conflict – peacefully. That is what PMAST does! We also learned there are many other issues these youth are struggling with and as a recently retired staff from the Calgary Young Offenders Centre indicated, the saddest thing is having the youth in lock up, then sending them back into the same environment without any new skills to cope with the issues that landed them there in the first place; and expecting them to be different. This process is not working and not realistic. Many juvenile offenders continue down this road until they age out and become adult offenders.

Based on the advice of experts in the field, we proposed developing an innovative program to join together the skills and resources already existing in the city and any others the youth-at-risk might need to turn their lives around. Airdrie has been selected for this pilot, with support of the Airdrie City Council. This proposal met with approval and funding by the Federal Youth Justice Fund and the Alberta Civil Society Fund, who together have provided funding for a three year project to develop and pilot the program. It is based on the premise that the model developed will be transferable to other locales. Stay tuned...

CONFLICT MANAGEMENT TRAINERS:

Her ongoing educational pursuits reflect her dedication to fostering understanding and growth across diverse communities. She channels her passion for working with youth outside the mediation room and remains steadfast in her mission to help leaders of all ages and backgrounds cultivate effective communication and conflict-resolution strategies.


SIYS envisions a world where all youth have the ability to overcome their struggles and achieve success.
